Opening Circle -

Facilitated by Doreen and Mwaringa

Participants were asked to share their names and a hobby of theirs with the aim of enabling participants to not only know one another but to be more free with one another in the learning journey

Facilitation Skills – facilitated by Mariam and Mwaringa:

Participants were divided into 2 groups and asked to develop role plays – one group focused on the "do's" of facilitation; the other was focused on the "don'ts" of facilitation. After presenting their role plays, this was followed by discussion and de-briefing



Intra-Personal Skills & Group Dynamics – facilitated by Mary and Deeja:

Key points of the discussion were:

- What is a group
- Types of groups
- Stages of group formation
- Characteristics of a group
- Qualities of a good leader

Closing Circle – facilitated by Martin

This was aimed at concluding the day's activities where participants were all asked to say a few words about the day and how they felt about the facilitation. The feedback from the participants was very positive.

Recommendations for the Future:

- Regular follow-up sessions with the participants members of Pwani Facilitators Network (PFN)
 are willing to undertake this due to their proximity to Ukunda
- 2. More intensive training on Facilitation skills and methods
- 3. Participation in other activities (those organised by the Red Cross volunteers)
- 4. Mentorship / peer mentorship in the family of Facilitators
- 5. Registering of Red Cross volunteers in the Facilitators Networks PFN, IAF etc.
